
We benefit from a rich mix of international partnerships, some long standing, others more recent.

A PROUD HISTORY



Our University was the original blueprint for the sought after model of collaboration with industry and practice. Today we occupy a distinctive place as an independent and commercially aware institution.

We have a distinguished 175-year history and are known as a university of firsts including:

- First Polytechnic Institution in the UK opening to the public on 6 August 1838
- First degree courses in Photographic Science, Photography, and Media Studies in the 1960s and 1970s
- First performance of a moving image picture show, to a paying British audience and the birthplace of British cinema. Regent Street Cinema was recently restored to its former glory, evoking its 19th century heritage



- The first modern university to win the Queen's Award for Enterprise
- The first UN Habitat Partner University
- Organised the first marathon race, at the London Olympics, over the now traditional distance of 26 miles, 385 yards in 1908.





GLOBAL ENGAGEMENT

The University is embedding internationalisation, employability and sustainability into all areas of it's work. Together these characteristics will position Westminster as a leading practice-focused and global university.

Internationalisation is key to the University's strategic vision and identity. We have extensive connections with universities and industries throughout the world and our Global Engagement Strategy seeks to strengthen and deepen those connections ever further. We will see Westminster International Networks (WINS) take on an ever more prominent role in our approach to internationalisation, reflecting opportunities and challenges in a dynamic, globally connected higher education landscape. Our international partnerships and teaching support the development of our academic and research portfolios. Experiences that enable our staff and students to operate in an increasingly interconnected, internationalised world are key to our approach.

GLOBAL PARTNERSHIPS AND TEACHING

- Westminster has a rich international partnerships network with cooperative relationships with partners in over 20 countries.
- Our partnerships build on key university strengths, and enable connections across a range of academic subject areas. We have exchanges with over 100 institutions, offering exciting education opportunities worldwide from Australia and Argentina to Sweden, Turkey and the USA.
- We have nearly 3,000 students studying on Westminster degree programmes taught overseas.
- As well as offering an extensive range of research programmes, we deliver more than 300 taught courses, many of which have a specifically international focus.

WIUT, Uzbekistan

Westminster International University in Tashkent (WIUT) was founded in 2002 in partnership with the University of Westminster and the UMID Foundation of the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan and became the first international university of Uzbekistan. All courses are designed in partnership with Westminster.

• IIT, Sri Lanka

The Informatics Institute of Technology (IIT) was established in 1990 as the first private higher education institute awarding reputed British degrees in the field of Information Communication Technology (ICT) and Business Communications.

CUC, China

Communications University China (CUC) is a '211' University recognised for its excellence in the areas of media and communication. Westminster has a long-standing partnership with CUC, working with them to deliver the Global Media Business MA in Beijing and London.

• Tempus: E-learning and distance learning in Biomedical Sciences in Southern Caucasus
Centred on the development of flexible and virtual learning platforms in Medical Molecular Biology, this pioneering project led by Westminster, secured the 'International Collaboration of the Year' award by the UK's Times Higher Education journal in 2012 and was highly commended by the EU.

REGIONS

SOUTH ASIA

Westminster has a longstanding connection with South Asia that can be traced back as far as 1841. Today we benefit from teaching and research partnerships with leading South Asian academic institutions and a thriving population of South Asian staff and students across all faculties.

Our partnerships in South Asia

Our relationships with South Asia aim to foster mutually beneficial collaboration in both teaching and research and build on strong links with Westminster alumni. We have links with more than 17 institutions including: IIT Madras and IIT Delhi, Anna University, Jamia Millia Islamia, Jawaharwal Nehru University and MEASI Academy of Architecture. Our partnerships provide Westminster students with opportunities to discover South Asia and we are working with institutions and alumni to support a range of mobility options from summer schools to volunteering, placement and exchanges.

Informatics Institute of Technology (IIT), Sri Lanka

IIT, established in 1990, is a pioneering institution in Sri Lanka for Information Communication Technology (ICT) and Business. Since 2005 Westminster and IIT have enjoyed a successful partnership enabling ITT to offer degree programmes validated by Westminster. These include Software Engineering BEng Honours, Information Systems with Business Management BSc Honours and Advanced Software Engineering MSc.

Our research links in South Asia

The University of Westminster has a distinctive and practical relationship with the region. With our depth of regional knowledge we specialise in academically distinguished research spanning disciplines such as architecture, film, the media, policy and politics. Westminster engages with a wide spectrum of research partners including government departments, industry, NGOs, the media, and other cultural bodies.

India Media Centre (IMC)

IMC is the world's first research and knowledge transfer centre dedicated to the study of India's diverse and dynamic media system. Since 1995, the IMC has hosted the annual Chevening Scholarships programme for young South Asian journalists. This prestigious programme is funded by the UK Foreign and Commonwealth Office.

Centre for the Study of Democracy (CSD)

CSD has particular expertise on South Asia focusing on community engagement and public debate. CSD's research theme of 'Post-Colonial Politics, Development and Emerging Powers' investigates how religion, history, territoriality, political economy, militarisation, democratisation and resistance have contributed to a volatile politics that disconnects states and people.

Our South Asian Student and Alumni Community

We are proud to host over 580 students from across South Asia. Westminster's Indian Alumni Network has over 900 active members. Linking graduating students with alumni back in India for placement, internship and mentoring opportunities. We also have over 1,000 alumni who have graduated from our programmes offered at IIT Colombo as well as alumni throughout Pakistan, Bangladesh and the South Asia region.

Our South Asian Team

The establishment in 2011 of our presence in Delhi was a new stage of the University's engagement with India. Our dedicated team of four staff support key aspects of the University's work in the region from student recruitment to partnership and alumni engagement.



CHINA AND HONG KONG

The University of Westminster's relationship with China goes back to the 1950s. As the first institution in the UK to specialise in modern spoken Chinese, we have taught generations of students about China, as well as welcoming students and visiting researchers from leading Chinese organisations and institutions.

Our partnerships in China and Hong Kong

Strengthening our engagement in China and Hong Kong is a core part of our Global Engagement Strategy, which focuses on positioning ourselves effectively in the region as well as increasing our collective understanding of the region with its rich and diverse culture.

Our strategic approach focuses on developing mutually beneficial links with universities as well as with the alumni community and we currently have cooperative relationships with over 20 universities in China and Hong Kong, including the following universities: Tsinghua, Peking, Tongji, China Central Academy of Fine Arts, Renmin, Guangdong University of Foreign Studies, Communications University of Foreign Studies, Seijing Jiaotong, Tianjin Foreign Studies, Shanghai University of Traditional Chinese Medicine, Donghua, China University of Hong Kong, Hong Kong Baptist and Hong Kong Polytechnic University.

Westminster regularly sends students on exchange to China and Hong Kong to deepen their knowledge of Chinese and China. Recently, newer partnerships have opened up opportunities for short term mobility, such as the 'Joint Studio' with China Central Academy of Fine Arts and the summer FAB FEST hosted in London with teams of students invited from China.

Our research links with China and Hong Kong

Westminster has extensive research links in China and East Asia that span all faculties.

Some of our key research links include:

China Media Centre

Established in 2005, the China Media Centre (CMC) has a unique position in the UK as a specialist media centre providing academic research and training, as well as engaging in commercial consultancy. The Centre has engaged in collaborative projects with China Central Television (CCTV), Shanghai Media Group, Hunan Satellite Broadcasting and other prestigious Chinese media institutions.

Faculty of Architecture and the Built Environment

Collaborative partnerships with the College of Architecture and Urban Planning, Tongji University, the College of Urban and Environmental Sciences, Peking University, and the School of Architecture, Tsinghua University support a broad range of academic initiatives to include seminars, joint research bids, joint academic publications and student and staff exchanges.

Contemporary China Centre

The Contemporary China Centre is a new and vibrant interdisciplinary hub for China-related research and related activities within and outside the University. Harriet Evans' internationally acclaimed research on women and gender in China has widely influenced attitudes towards gender.

REGIONS

EASTmedicine research group

EASTmedicine (East Asian Sciences and Traditions in Medicine) is a unique interdisciplinary research group that seeks to understand the development and transformation of East Asian medicines from their origins in pre-Han China to the present.

Professor Volker Scheid's work within the EAST*medicine* research group has contributed to a reinvigoration of interest in areas of Chinese medicine. The research group regularly hosts visiting researchers from China with particular links in Changzhou, Jiangsu Province, and Shanghai.

Our Chinese and Hong Kong Student and alumni community

Our long history in China means that we have a strong and active alumni network with over 1600 registered alumni located across China, especially in Guangzhou, Shanghai and Beijing.

The University has a committee of alumni volunteers who support the University in organising social and professional networking events for alumni in the region, as well as promoting the University as a place to study.

In Hong Kong, we have over 800 alumni. This includes an Alumni Advisory Group, who support the University's wider global engagement agenda, including brokering connections with important academic partners in the region.

Our team in Beijing

The University first opened its operation in Beijing in August 2011 and now has a team of three based in GROK, Beijing. The team support on key aspects of the University's global engagement work in the region and regularly travel around China, Hong Kong and Taiwan.



UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

The University of Westminster has a proud legacy of working with institutions and organisations in the United States and developing strong research and cultural connections between both countries going back to 1886. Our links embrace diverse activities from research initiatives, study abroad, faculty exchange, summer schools to public engagement events and conferences.

Our partnerships and research links in the USA

The University has extensive partnerships with institutions in the United States such as the Fashion Institute of Technology in New York, University of Miami, Johns Hopkins University and several Smithsonian museums in Washington D.C including the Lemelson Center for the Study of Invention and Innovation at the National Museum of American History, the National Air and Space Museum and the new National Museum of African American History and Culture.

In 2007, following an international conference organised by Westminster to celebrate the Smithsonian's 150th anniversary, the Smithsonian-Westminster Colloquium was established.

The partnership between the University and Smithsonian museums has resulted in an extensive programme of events and initiatives in London and Washington DC, including scholar visits, public programmes, workshops and research projects. Most notably, a programme celebrating the founding of the Nobel Prize, a public forum in London entitled 'Crossing Boundaries - Promoting Innovation and Creativity', and the International Eco-Cities Initiative, a multi-national research network coordinated by scholars at the University of Westminster, the Johns Hopkins University and the Smithsonian's Lemelson Center.

Our US student community

There are currently over 900 visiting students and 135 undergraduate and postgraduate American students enrolled at Westminster studying subjects such as International Relations, History, Film, Business Management, Marketing, Music, Fashion and Journalism.

Westminster's Study Abroad programme is one of the oldest and best established programmes in the UK and we are consistently ranked as the top destination for US Study Abroad students in the UK. We are also a partner of the Generation Study Abroad initiative and we have established a US study abroad scholarship as part of our pledge.

Our US alumni

The United States is home to one of the largest groups of Westminster alumni with more than 6,000 alumni, many of whom joined the University on Study Abroad or exchange programmes.

The University organises alumni gatherings in the United States, particularly in New York and Washington DC, and is looking to develop the alumni networks further with the support of regional ambassadors.



CAMPUSES AND FACULTIES

The University's estates spread across 170,000m² in the heart of the capital city. A £125 million cutting-edge refurbishment programme of the University buildings and facilities finished recently, including the redevelopment of our Harrow and Marylebone campuses, the Marylebone halls of residence, the Regent Street Gym and social learning spaces.

REGENT CAMPUS

Our Regent Campus, located in central London near Oxford Circus, is the headquarters of the University of Westminster and is on The National Heritage List for England. A major redevelopment project was recently completed to restore the birthplace of British Cinema – The Regent Street Cinema, as this is where the Lumière brothers screened the first performance of a moving film to a UK paying audience in 1896. The campus features a state-of-the-art gym and social space with a café. A short walk away from our Regent Campus is our Little Titchfield site that has just completed a £3.5 million transformation, including new library and state-of-the-art lecture theatre and social spaces.



Social Sciences and Humanities

As one of the University's largest faculties, we have excellent resources and facilities across our wide range of course specialisations, including English, Linguistics and Cultural Studies, Modern and Applied Languages, Politics and International Relations. Our politics courses were ranked in the top three nationally, and our English and Creative Writing courses were all in the UK's top 20 for added value.

The Faculty of Social Sciences and Humanities incorporates **Westminster Law School**. As one of London's leading providers of legal education, our practice based approach helps students develop rapidly into confident legal professionals.



MARYLEBONE CAMPUS

Our Marylebone Campus is located in the heart of London opposite Baker Street tube station and Madame Tussauds. It is well known for our leading business and architecture programmes.

The recently refurbished campus is home to our Bloomberg Financial Markets Suite, our Fab Lab (launched in Spring 2015) consisting of a wide selection of digital equipment that provides facilities ranging from desktop 3D printing and CNC knife cutting, to large scale CNC routing, CNC metal milling and robot fabrication. In addition, the site houses Ambika P3, a vast underground exhibition space that has been used by artists such as Keith Wilson, Richard Woods, David Ward and Alison Wilding, and by creative industry clients including Marks & Spencer, Heineken, Sony, Calvin Klein and Nike.



Architecture and the Built Environment

Westminster has one of the UK's leading faculties for the study of Architecture and the Built Environment. We teach the majority of subjects that make up our built environment in one campus, one of the few UK universities to do so. The Faculty was ranked joint second in the UK by practising architects.

Westminster Business School

Being on the doorstep of global businesses, Westminster Business School provides strong links with business and government. All of our business degrees are professionally focused to prepare students for working in their chosen careers. The School has a strong international outlook with 30 per cent of our students being from abroad.





CAMPUSES AND FACULTIES



CAVENDISH CAMPUS

Our Cavendish Campus offers a diverse and vibrant learning environment in central London. Our state-of-the-art laboratories at New Cavendish Street were recently completely refurbished as part of a £30 million modernisation plan. The Campus is home to the Faculty of Science and Technology.

Science and Technology

With a broad range of courses across the STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) subjects, the Faculty is divided into five academic departments: Biomedical Sciences, Computing, Engineering, Life Sciences and Psychology. The Faculty has undertaken pioneering research and provides students with practical-based learning in a supportive environment.



HARROW CAMPUS

Our Harrow Campus, located just 20 minutes from central London by tube, has recently undergone a major redevelopment project. The Campus features some of the best educational state-of-the-art film, television and music studios, computer technology and broadcast equipment in Europe. It is home to Westminster School of Media, Arts and Design.

Media, Arts and Design

Westminster School of Media, Arts and Design plays a significant role in educating the next generation of media professionals, filmmakers and photographers, fashion designers, music performers and producers, artists and multimedia communicators and professionals for the creative industries.

The faculty pursues an integrated focus on professional practice and world-leading research with societal impact. Covering the intersection of media, creative practices, technology and industry with a broad and diverse portfolio of taught and research programmes, the faculty has proven to successfully prepare its graduates to lead and shape the creative industries. In 2016, the QS Worldwide University Rankings has placed the research and courses in Media, Journalism and Communications at the University of Westminster among the top 30 globally.







EMPLOYABILITY

WE PUT EMPLOYABILITY AT THE CENTRE OF UNIVERSITY LIFE

Students have opportunities to enhance their practical experience through internships, professional placements, study abroad and volunteering or mentoring programmes.

Our Career Development Centre excels in employer engagement. Placement opportunities have included the BBC, Sony, Financial Times, British Airways, Google ATP, Warner Brothers, GlaxoSmithKline, the British Museum, Chanel, Commonwealth Games, Disney Europe, Dior, European Commission, African Education Trust, Heinz, Microsoft, Nokia, Amnesty UK, Volkswagen, Hewlett-Packard and many other global companies and organisations.

The Career Development Centre at the University of Westminster offers **over 6,000 opportunities** that enhance our students' employability.

All Westminster students are encouraged to undertake a work placement which can form part of their degree and hundreds of students are matched with business mentors.

More than 50 separate professional organisations and bodies offer accreditation, approval or recognition of our courses.

There are over one million businesses operating with 20 miles of the University, making us ideally placed to work with leading employers and enabling us to shape professionally relevant courses.

The University works with more than 3,000 companies.

Employers worldwide place increasing value on international and intercultural competence. Westminster students benefit from a broad range of opportunities to take part in an international student exchange. Options include; international summer schools, field trips and semester and full year overseas placements.

Westminster currently has a network of 70 exchange partnerships across 21 countries.



RESEARCH



With 175 years' of pioneering applied research, stemming from our foundation by the celebrated Victorian engineer Sir George Cayley in 1838, the University of Westminster's research today is at the forefront of exploring critical contemporary economic, societal and scientific issues.

The 2014 Research Excellence Framework confirmed our world leading positions in Art and Design and Media and Communications and internationally excellent research in English, Architecture and the Built Environment and Allied Health. Additionally, Psychology and Neuroscience, Politics, Area studies, and Law are acknowledged for their excellence.

Research outputs in 11 of the 13 subject areas submitted for review in the REF have been assessed as 'world leading'. The proportion of research outputs judged as world leading was double that achieved in the 2008 review.

There was an outstanding result for English Language and Literature, which climbed nearly 50 places in the Times Higher Education rankings, and the research outputs of which were rated among the top 20 departments in the country, with nearly 80 per cent of their publications judged to be world-leading (4*) or internationally excellent (3*).



- The Faculty of Architecture and the Built Environment research is internationally excellent or world leading in applied, theoretical or policy areas. Monsoon Assemblages is funded by the European Research Council. Its aim is to confront challenges of urban climate change through theoretically driven spatial enquiries into the impacts of urbanisation on monsoon climates in Chennai, Delhi and Dhaka, with wider application for other cities.
- The Faculty of Science and Technology has produced research of internationally recognised (3*) or world-leading (4*) quality in Allied Health, Psychology and Neuroscience. Researchers from the Faculty led by the renowned Ebola expert and Senior Lecturer in Medical Microbiology, Dr Edward Wright have been awarded a grant to develop an innovative portable device to test bodily fluids to diagnose the Ebola virus.
- The Communication and Media Research Institute (CAMRI) in Westminster School of Media, Arts and Design has long been noted for its strong international dimension.
- The China Media Centre, Arab Media Centre, India Media Centre and Africa Media Centre provide a focus for high quality research, policy analysis and industry training. 
